Behaviour and Code of Conduct

The established Blair Drummond Safari Park Rules, Behaviour Policy and Code of Conduct will apply on all school visits, both primary and secondary. All school organisers will be made fully aware of this before the visit. Blair Drummond Safari Park is a smoke, vape, alcohol and illegal substance free family outdoor attraction and all those participating in the visit must agree to abide by the Safari Park Rules, Behaviour Policy and Code of Conduct in advance.

Pupils and Students will:

- Follow the instructions of staff and supervising adults without delay or argument.
- Take responsibility for their actions and do nothing to endanger themselves or others.
- Report all accidents or damage to the teacher or group leader or a member of staff.
- Show respect and act with courtesy towards others, including the general public and park staff.
- Be helpful, co-operative and considerate to others, including the general public and park staff.
- Tidy up after having packed lunches in any areas of the park, using provided bins and leave the areas clean (e.g. white marquee, undercover picnic areas, etc.)
- Park facilities such as toilets must be kept clean and tidy and should any areas require attention a member of staff should be notified.
- Schools attending any animals' demonstrations need to be seated before the start of the session.

Pupils and Students will not:

- Act in a threatening or intimidating manner.
- Use inappropriate language.
- Leave their group and go off on their own unless they are 16 years old and above.
- Take part in any activity, which has not been authorised by their teachers or group leader.
